# **Summer 2022 Orientation**

We are excited to return to fully in-person Orientation programs for 2022! In order to have in-person sessions, our office will be operating in accordance with university and local COVID-19 guidelines. At this time, all Orientation participants will be required to adhere to any and all campus policies related to COVID-19 during their attendance. 
## **Summer Term Orientation**

If you are beginning classes in May (Summer Term), you will attend a Summer Term Orientation session. These are in-person, one-day sessions during which you will need to be available from 7:30 a.m. - 5 p.m. You will hear from university faculty and staff, meet with an Orientation Leader and peers, attend an academic college visit, learn about university resources and take care of several campus business items. In addition, this is when you will meet with an academic advisor and get registered for summer term courses. A continental breakfast and lunch will be provided. **Registration costs are \$130 per student and \$50 per family member and/or guest.** More information regarding Summer Term Orientation will be shared via email.

# **Fall Term Orientation**

If you are beginning classes in August (Fall Term), you will attend a Fall Term Orientation session in June or July. These are in-person, two-day sessions during which you will need to be available beginning at 8 a.m. on day one and 7:45 a.m. on day two. **Students are required to stay overnight in one of our designated residence halls on day one. This will not be the same residence hall you are living in during the academic year.** During the two days you will hear from university faculty and staff, meet with an Orientation Leader and peers, attend an academic college visit, learn about university resources and the city of Columbia, tour campus, participate in evening socials and take care of several campus business items. In addition, this is when you will meet with an advisor and get registered for fall courses. A continental breakfast, lunch and dinner will be provided on day one of your session and a continental breakfast and lunch will be provided on day two of your session. **Registration costs are \$250 per student and \$115 per family member and/or guest. Overnight accommodations for families and guest will accrue an additional charge.** More information regarding Fall Term Orientation and overnight accommodations will be shared to the email address you provide during registration.

## Welcome to the Family!

While supporting students throughout their transition to college, our office understands this can be a time full of excitement, but also uncertainty for families. That's why New Student Orientation is not just for students: it's also for families and guests!

Whether attending Summer Term or Fall Term Orientation, our Family and Guest program runs concurrently with New Student Orientation and focuses on a wide variety of topics and subjects that families and guests should find helpful during their student's first year.

Families and guests will have the opportunity to connect with administration, faculty and staff to discuss their student's needs and upcoming experiences. They will also have an opportunity to learn more about their student's academic college and major.

Families attending Fall Term Orientation with their student are invited to stay overnight in the residence halls on day one of their session, but are not required to. More information regarding on- and off-campus overnight accommodations for families and guests will be shared via email. **The registration cost for Summer Term Orientation is \$50 per family member and/or guest. The registration cost for Fall Term Orientation is \$115 per family member and/or guest. Overnight accommodations during Fall Term Orientation for families and guest will accrue an additional charge.**

The Office of New Student Orientation is proud to offer an award-winning Veterans Student Orientation program for veterans, active-duty military personnel and dependents beginning classes at the university in **summer or fall term**. In partnership with the <u>Office of Veteran and Military Services</u>, attendees will learn more about utilizing VA benefits, as well as services and resources available to them as students. These sessions run concurrently with our general New Student Orientation program. Our office will send out updates via email regarding Veteran Student Orientation and how to register.

## **International Students**

International students are required to attend New Student Orientation, whether beginning classes in the **summer or fall term**. In order to have a successful experience during your session, we encourage you to stay connected with the contact person in <u>International Student Services</u>, as they may have specific instructions for you regarding New Student Orientation and advising and registration.

# **HOW TO REGISTER FOR ORIENTATION**



Your next step is simple: Register for your New Student Orientation! You can do so beginning on **Monday, April 4 at Noon**. In order to begin your New Student Orientation experience, you will need to:

# Pay your enrollment deposit.

Incoming freshman students are required to pay a \$200 admissions deposit to confirm enrollment before gaining access to New Student Orientation registration. Please note that electronic check payments will be held for six (6) business days while it clears.

# Verify your session.

If you are beginning classes in May (Summer Term), you will need to attend a one-day session in May. If you are beginning classes in August (Fall Term), you will need to attend a two-day, overnight session in June or July. Visit the <u>"Find My Orientation"</u> page on our website to learn more about verifying your session.

## Set up your account.

Using your VIP ID and USC ID, you will set up your account and log on to Self Service Carolina. You will be prompted to complete the following steps:

- Add security questions for account verification.
- Access your UofSC email and set up your email preferences.
- Add emergency contact information.
- Set Up Multi-factor Authentication.

## Make your reservation.

Using a laptop or desktop, device go to <u>my.sc.edu</u> and log in with your VIP ID and password. Click the "Admissions" tab and then the "Orientation Services" link. Select your campus from the drop down menu and follow the instructions on the screen. Only available session dates will appear on your screen. Please note: Registration is only accessible through Google Chrome or Firefox browsers.



# Pay for your session.

Your reservation will not be complete until you have paid for your New Student Orientation session. The registration cost for Summer Term Orientation is \$130 per student and \$50 per family member and/or guest. The registration cost for Fall Term Orientation is \$250 per student and \$115 per family member and/or guest. Overnight accommodations during Fall Term Orientation for families and guest will accrue an additional charge.

# **6** Prepare for your session.

Once you have registered, read through all of your session information and stay connected to your email for updates from the Office of New Student Orientation. You will receive an email confirmation for your registration. If you do not receive one upon registering for a session, please contact our office to ensure you have completed all steps.

Please contact the Office of New Student Orientation if you need to make any changes to your reservation.





As you begin to prepare for your New Student Orientation, it is important that you complete the items on the checklist below. Several components of your New Student Orientation are guided by your major, as well as advising and registration. Incompletion of any of the these items may impact your ability to register for classes during your session.

# Complete all items in Your Admissions Portal

Your Admissions Portal contains information that must be completed before you attend your New Student Orientation and enroll for classes at South Carolina. It is essential you complete all items in the Admissions Portal.

# Submit your Citizenship Verification

Log on to your UofSC Admissions Portal to check if your status was previously verified based on information provided on your FAFSA. If you have not submitted a FAFSA, you will be required to complete the Citizenship Verification Form.

If your citizenship has not been verified, complete the **Citizenship Verification Form**. Visit <u>sc.edu/registrar</u> for more information on the Citizenship Verification Form.

# Submit your Residency Verification (For SC residents only)

Students claiming South Carolina residency for tuition purposes are required to verify residency. Log on to your UofSC Admissions Portal to check if your South Carolina residency has been verified. We will use the information provided on your FAFSA to determine whether or not you need to complete the South Carolina Residency Certification Form. If you have not submitted a FAFSA, you will be required to complete the form.

If your residency has not been verified, complete the S.C. Residency Certification Form through your portal. Visit sc.edu/registrar for more information on the residency certification process.

# **Submit your Immunization Form**

Submit your completed Immunization Record Form no later than two weeks prior to your New Student Orientation. Upload your records to <u>sc.edu/myhealthspace</u> portal under Immunization. Login with your network username and password and your birth date. Forms may also be faxed to 803-777-3955/ 803-777-3960 or mailed to the Allergy, Immunization & Travel Clinic, 1409 Devine Street, Columbia, SC 29208.

# **PREPARING FOR ORIENTATION**

# **Confirm your major**

If you are considering a major change prior to attending Orientation, make a "New Student Major Change Interest" appointment to speak with an Exploratory Advisor in the University Advising Center. Your Exploratory Advisor will make sure you have all of the correct information. Make an appointment by visiting <u>sc.campus.eab.com</u>. You may also contact the University Advising Center at 803-777-1222 or advising@sc.edu. It is critical that you attend Orientation with the correct major.

## **Register for your Math Placement Exam**

All students are required to take the online Math Placement Test no later than two weeks before your New Student Orientation. You will record your test score on your Pre-Orientation Advising Worksheet. For more information including practice tests and instructions for completing the test online, visit <u>math.sc.edu/assess</u>.

# Register for your Foreign Language Placement Exam

Every student at South Carolina has to take the Foreign Language Placement Exam before taking a foreign language course to determine whether or not they meet course prerequisites. For further information, please visit the <u>Language Placement</u> <u>Testing Website</u>.

# Have copies of your unofficial Transcripts and any AP/IB score reports

Have copies of your AP/IB/Cambridge (AICE) scores and dual enrollment transcripts available during your New Student Orientation. If your scores do not arrive before your scheduled advising session, make a list of the test(s) you have taken and share this with your advisor. If official transcripts are not available, you may use an unofficial transcript during your session. Your advisor may also ask you to email copies of these documents prior to your meeting.

# Complete your Pre-Orientation Advising Modules and Worksheet

You will access and view your Pre-Orientation Advising Modules in your Orientation Portal after registration. Please complete all modules, as well as your <u>Pre-Orientation Advising Worksheet</u> in order to prepare for your advising and registration appointment during New Student Orientation.

# Request your CarolinaCard Online

Go to <u>my.carolinacard.sc.edu</u> and read and complete the Cardholder Agreement and Account Access Information. Review the list of acceptable photos and upload your photo. If your photo is accepted, you may pick up your card during New Student Orientation.
